Lunch Bunch



<u>Sweet Potato Balls</u>

6 medium sweet potatoes, cooked peeled and mashed (approx. 4 cups mashed)
1 stick (1/2 cup) butter or margarine
1 cup chopped pecans or walnuts
1 cup brown sugar
12 large marshmallows
2 cups crushed cornflakes

Mix sweet potatoes with margarine, sugar and nuts. Form a ball around 1 marshmallow. (Cut the marshmallows in half if you want smaller portions.); roll in crushed cornflakes. repeat with remaining marshmallows. Place balls on greased 9x13 baking dish. Bake at 400° for 15 minutes.
