
Kids Can Cook

Two-Tone Caramel Brownies

Preheat oven to 350°. Line a 13x9-in. baking pan with parchment; grease paper. In a large bowl, beat chocolate cake mix, melted butter, and 1/3 cup evaporated milk until blended; batter will be thick. Reserve 1/4 cup batter for topping. Spread remaining batter into prepared pan. Bake 6 minutes.

1 pkg. chocolate cake mix 1 large egg, room temp. 3/4 cup butter, melted

1 can (5 oz.) evaporated milk, divided

1 pkg. (11 oz.) Kraft caramel bites

1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

1 pkg. yellow cake mix

1/2 cup plus 1 Tbsp. butter, softened, divided 1 can (14 oz.) sweetened condensed milk

1 pkg. (11.5 oz.) milk chocolate chips

Meanwhile, in a microwave, melt caramel bits and remaining 1/3 cup evaporated milk; stir until smooth. Sprinkle hot chocolate crust with semi-sweet chips; pour caramel mixture over top. In another large bowl, beat yellow cake mix, egg, 1/2 cup softened butter until combined; batter will be thick. Reserve half for topping. Crumble remaining mixture over caramel layer. Bake 6 minutes. In microwave, melt sweetened condensed milk, milk chocolate chips and 1 Tbsp. softened butter. Stir until smooth. Pour over yellow cake layer. Sprinkle with reserved yellow and chocolate cake batters. Bake 20-25 minutes or until top is golden brown.
