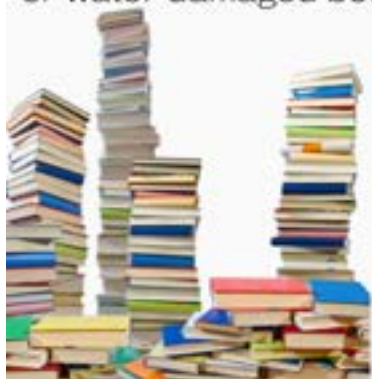


## Get Ready...Get Set...

### Raspberry-Swirled Lemon Milk Shakes

2 cups fresh or frozen raspberries, thawed

1/4 cup confectioners' sugar

1/2 cup 2% milk

2 cups vanilla ice cream, softened

1 cup lemon sorbet, softened

3/4 cup crushed ice

Optional garnishes: whipped cream, fresh blueberries or raspberries, mint sprigs.

Place the raspberries and confectioners' sugar in a blender; cover and process until blended. Strain and discard seeds. In a clean blender, combine the milk, ice cream, sorbet and ice; cover and process 30 seconds or until smooth. Layer raspberry puree and ice cream mixture into four serving glasses. Add garnishes if desired.

*Use blueberries as a garnish to create a festive red white and blue treat!*

Join Wyandot County Public Health and the Mental Health and Recovery Services Board of local counties in learning about the Science of Addiction on July 13th at 6 p.m. in USCL's large meeting room.

The program will discuss the Healing Communities Study in Wyandot County, current drug usage trends in the community and state, lessons learned regarding behavioral health services, and finally how to access services for treatment and recovery. Wyandot County Public Health staff will also share the current resources available to Wyandot County residents for safe drug disposal and will educate attendees about Narcan (naloxone) resources in the event of an overdose.
