
help but suspect the hand of a supernatural killer.

uncooked pie crust, store bought or homemade 1/2 cup butter melted

1 1/4 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips divided 1/2 cup flour

1/2 cup brown sugar


1/2 cup sugar

2 large eggs beaten

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup chopped pecans

3/4 cup flaked coconut



Pour into unbaked pie crust. Bake 35-40 minutes or until top is set. DON'T OVER BAKE! Allow to cool before serving.

Optional: top with some whipped topping, toasted coconut, and chocolate shavings or dust with a little cocoa powder.
